Care Coordination Presentation to Colleagues

Care coordination is a key element of mental health care planning and coordination. It is imagined as a collaborative, recovery-focused, activity which engages service users, <u>care coordination presentation to colleagues ps</u> in the pursuit of shared recovery goals.

However, it is not consistently being done in the way policymakers imagine. In the real world of work, it is often carried out in a context of significant administrative demands and subject to performance management which distorts its primary purpose and promotes generic professional roles.

What is the purpose of this presentation?

Your nurse manager has asked you to develop a care coordination presentation for your colleagues. She expects you to provide your staff with basic information about the care coordination process so that they can take an expanded role in managing the system and improving patient outcomes at your community care center.

What is the audience for this presentation?

Care coordination is not a process in isolation but rather involves several related activities – from assessing needs to planning, coordinating and reviewing services. It is also a multidisciplinary and cross-sectoral activity, involving nurses and physicians in equal measure. It is important to understand that coordinating patient care can have positive effects on healthcare outcomes, lowering costs and improving patient experiences.

To be effective, a care coordination presentation needs to be well designed, engaging and sparked by a clear purpose that makes the audience think about what you have to say. <u>buy nursing papers</u> can be achieved by focusing on the key points in a succinct and informative manner. The presentation should be a blend of scholarly and practical content. This should be done in an interactive format and is best facilitated by having a professional, knowledgeable and friendly presenter. It is a good idea to prepare the presentation in advance of delivering it and to have a few back-up slides. This will allow you to be prepared for any unexpected questions and to deliver the most interesting and relevant information at the point of need.

What is the format for this presentation?

Care coordination is an area of expertise that can be used for both the patient and the institution. The process of aligning the various facets of a patient's health care experience in order to make it more effective is a science unto itself. This is particularly true in the case of the elderly, who may be dealing with multiple medical issues at once. The key to implementing a successful care coordination <u>write my</u> <u>dissertation for me</u> to recognize that not all patients have the same level of complexity in their medical needs, or have the same medical history as one another. This requires a bit of trial and error to determine what works best for each individual patient. The best way to do this is by using a multi-disciplinary approach that considers each patient's individualized healthcare needs and wants. What is the content of this presentation?

Those who practise care coordination place a premium on the quality of their relationships with service users, assessing needs and planning and coordinating services in ways which reflect shared knowledge of individuals' hopes, strengths and aspirations.

However, these'relational' aspects of the work are not always fully reflected in the actual practice of care coordination. Instead, the work itself becomes 'paper' and 'task' orientated with the consequences of this that it distorts its primary purpose.

The complexity of <u>nurs fpx 4050 assessment 3 care coordination presentation to</u> <u>colleagues ps</u> and the complexities of the systems of care, which they are part of, also mean that the way in which care coordination is done is complex and adaptable. This requires 'articulation' of both the trajectories of individual experiences over time and the work which is simultaneously done by people working across healthcare sectors, organisations and professions.
